

Extended pedestrian realm using street painting / paving & movable furniture Rumbles, Speed Tables, and Raised Crosswalks






2) Budget Addback Process

Proposed Approach – Part 1: General Requests

- All parking spaces are defined with painted demarcations
- Signage at all intersections
 - At 4-way intersections: four STOP signs
 - At 3-way "T" intersections: a STOP sign at the terminating street, and two YIELD signs at the continuing street
- Visible crosswalks at all intersections
 - Raised crosswalks at all non-Muni crossings
 - Painted bulb-outs at locations without physical bulb-outs or raised crosswalks (Vision Zero MTA)
- <u>Neighborhood identification blade signage</u> at all street signs
- Repair all damaged bulb-outs
- Fill all planter boxes/strips



Focus Area 1: Castro Commons (Noe Market Plaza)

Accent paving between Market and Beaver

- Real brick, stamped texture, paint, etc.

Custom large gateway sign

- Arched across the street if allowed by MTA & PW

Enhanced lighting

- Additional streetlights or string lights across street
